March 22, 2020 The assigned texts are Isaiah 42:14-21, Psalm 142, Ephesians 5:8-14 (read verses 15-20 too) and John 9

Dear Friends at Bethlehem,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

Bill Jansen, your congregational president, and I have spoken on the phone about how to be the church in these weeks of "Social Distancing". It is a challenge that none of us has ever had to face before. As a pastor, I never would have thought the time would come when our bishop would strongly suggest that we all stay home from corporate worship – for weeks! We all know that we gain spiritual strength when we gather with others, listen to the Word, pray, sing, and receive Holy Communion—and drink coffee. But in these days, keeping physical distance from each other is the best way we can "love our neighbors as ourselves." And we **can** worship with those who live in our households. If you live alone, you **can** praise God and pray, and even sing!

In today's Psalm, the writer cries out to God with his complaints and troubles, and when he grows depressed ("my spirit is faint"). The news has not reported any cases of Covid-19 in Pine County, so we are not dealing with the virus directly, but we worry about our loved ones in Washington and New York and the many places in between. We watch our retirement funds shrivel and worry that our plans were in vain. We can feel lonely and deprived of our normal interactions and activities. We are feeling what other people have felt throughout time, and God listens to our thoughts and feelings as we pray. We can know that God is listening, and doesn't it help to know that someone else listened to us?

The virus does feel like a persecutor and we may feel we are in a prison, but we don't have to wait to be freed to know that God "will deal bountifully with me." If I am not sick, I have a safe and warm place to stay, and I have enough food – God has dealt bountifully with me. We can give thanks for our other blessings as well—telephones, televisions, radios, and computers that help us stay connected with others. We just have to use them.

God is with us and will bring us though these troubling times, just as he led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt and through the desert. Remember that desert journey was without a map, and the people often complained and wandered after other gods, and it took them 40 years, but God kept them fed and gave them water and led their children into the promised land. God will bring his people through this desert as well.

As you wander through these days, remember you are not alone. Make contact with friends by phone, or write letters. Pray for our world, health care workers, decision makers, those now unemployed... Ask God for the strength to do so.

I am closing with the words of Isaiah 43:1-3a, these words comfort me and remind me that I am God's:

'But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel; "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine.

When you pass through the waters I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not over whelm you;

when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.""

The Lord bless you and keep you.

The Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you. The Lord look upon you with favor and give you peace.

## March 11, 2020 Unapproved Minutes

**MEMBERS PRESENT:** Bill Jansen, Cheryl Kohner, Andy May, Marilyn Krogh, Chuck Moon, Heidi Moon, and Jo Foss.

Bill called the meeting to order. Members checked in with each other. Bill offered prayer.

APPROVE FEBRUARY 2020 MINUTES: Minutes were reviewed. Motion made by Chuck, second by Bill to accept the minutes as read. Motion carried.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Treasurer's report was reviewed.

## MINISTRY REPORTS:

- Property—Chuck reported that the parsonage is being monitored. Carpet for the church basement dining area might be installed after May 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Family Ministry—Jo reported that a time and date for an adult bible study is still being worked on. Shawn is looking at bible study materials for it.
- Music and Worship— Bill reported that pulpit supply is scheduled through the end of April. Larry Anderson is scheduled through Holy week to Easter. Bill is also checking into recorded music should the need

arise.

• Circle of Faith—Jo reported that the meeting on Saturday, March 14<sup>th</sup> they would be checking out chairs for the church dining area.

## **OLD BUSINESS:**

- Call Process—Bill has contacted area churches to see if there is any interest in partnering with BLC.
- Shut in visitation/communion distribution— Tabled until we are past the coronavirus
- Internet service provider —Heidi reported she has been checking into costs to switch from Frontier to SCI. Motion by Chuck, second by Andy to switch to SCI. Motion carried.
- Model Constitution— Tabled.
- Goal Setting—Table until next regular meeting.
- Basement chair replacement—Jo reported that Circle has found a suitable chair style and what the costs would be for 100 chairs. A fundraiser will be held with letter to go out to congregation in the near future to help purchase the chairs. Motion by Bill, second by Marilyn to modify the letter with approved changes. Motion carried.

## **New Business:**

• Coronavirus information/protocols—Jo discussed with us information about the virus and will be drafting a letter to go out to all congregation members after the special council meeting (Tuesday, March 17<sup>th</sup>) to further discuss protocols that need to be put in place.

- Church usage request— Margaret Christensen has requested use of the church on June 6<sup>th</sup> for a piano recital. Motion by Chuck, second by Bill to approve. Motion carried.
- Fellowship area and mini fridge—Heidi reported that food is being left in the fridge and dishes are also being left upstairs in the fellowship area.

Please remember to clean up after your meetings and NO food is to be left in the mini fridge or in the fellowship area.

• Audit—Bill will be checking with Erica Ludwig to set up a date to do our 2019 audit.

- A special church council meeting is set for Tuesday, March 17<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm to discuss protocols on dealing with the coronavirus.

## CALL TO ORDER/PRAYER

### **New Business:**

- Church closure— Motion by Chuck, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bill to cancel all church activities until further notice. Motion carried.
- Suspension of Services —No services until further notice.
- Church building usage restriction—Restricted until further notice.
- General use—No activities until further notice.
- Cleaning schedule approved to have Diane disinfect each week and keep a log of which areas that have been done.
- Annual Church cleaning—cancelled.
- Counters—Motion by Bill to allow Heidi to count independently while the church is closed, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jo. Motion carried.

• Church office hours— Heidi will continue to operate the church office during the hours of 10 am to 3 pm, Monday through Thursday, unless "shelter in place" is required. It was discussed checking with SCI to see if there is a way for Heidi to retrieve church messages from home should this become necessary.

- Buddy system—Jo discussed having a call list of those who are living alone and may need someone to check in with them. More discussion on this to follow.

- Help line—Discussed with no decision made at this time.
- Newspaper—Heidi has been in contact with the local papers for announcements regarding cancellations of Sunday services, Lenten soup suppers and services, and community meals.
- Online resources— Discussion on how to communicate updates regarding COVID-19.
- Social Media— Discussion on using social media to get the word out regarding BLC COVID-19 protocols.
- Video streaming— Discussed with no decision made at this time.
- Virtual visitation— Discussed with no decision made at this time.
- Funerals—Tabled until next meeting.
- Basement chair update—the letter will go out to members once we are passed the COVID-19 issues.

- Chuck will send a message to Denny regarding property, and will speak with Ovid regarding entrance into the church. He will also take down the two community meal signs.
