

A Message From Our SAM

My Quilt Walk

This quilt pattern is called the walking labyrinth by its sewer, Lori Kern. When I saw it, I had to stop and use it. Use it you may wonder? Yes, not as a cover but in prayer.

Many of you may have heard of or even walked a labyrinth. Unlike mazes, a real labyrinth has no tricks, turns, obstacles or dead ends. There is only one route to the center and back out again. It gently guides walkers, allowing them to enter a meditative state in which their focus is simply on placing one foot in front of the other (some people do this movement in a dance like form)... while in prayer. They have become a popular spiritual practice among Christians. It lets you reflect, pray, and **connect with God** – which deepens our faith. Labyrinths are used world-wide as a way to quiet the mind, calm anxieties, recover balance in life, enhance creativity and encourage meditation, insight, self-reflection and stress reduction. Prayer goes well with walking no matter how short or long the path. A single pathway labyrinth holds the



walking pilgrim in the unifying context of sacred space, opening an accessible route into the **heart of grace** – teaching compassion and the recognition and appreciation of walking one's path with presence, heart and peace.

I could not walk this quilt – but I could follow it with my eyes while I prayed – which I did. There are many patterns you can see during your day that you can follow and pray through. Or maybe create your own labyrinth to guide you. Shovel a path this winter or mow a circle next summer, are some suggestions.





I urge you to pray – create what you need to – to make this happen. December can bring about emotions that this sacred space could lift or lighten - God wants to hear from us in prayer.
