

Visioning Committee Meeting Minutes May 9, 2023

Present: Minister Clara Edin, Pastor Jacob Burkman, Amy Frazer, Bill Jansen, Laura McCaughan, Greta Detzler, and Yvette Maloney.

Opened with prayer – 6:33 pm

After our last meeting Amy shared the message with Grace's Council. There was some confusion with Emmanuel's Council and possibly some with Grace's as well, as to what direction we are planning on heading. The best description would be acceptance with regret.

Emmanuel Council recognizes and acknowledges results of the recent survey along with Bethlehem's satisfaction in their current ministries. It is recommended that future mutual ministries be clearly defined at the next meeting in May.

Bethlehem council agrees that mutual ministries and working together, even if we are not adjoining parishes - at this time.

Is the hope or goal to formalize a mutual ministry agreement?

Discussed listing out what each congregation does

individually and see what wants are had for mutual ministries. Some wants are things like youth groups, joint church choir, those sorts of things put together. Mutually holding confirmation classes. Churches are working on promoting each other's activities in bulletins and announcements already. Work to get any information to the churches secretaries before Tuesday of the week they want the information in the bulletins. Maybe it would be easiest to have the secretaries share calendars with each other for upcoming churches events.

Clarification of the discussion of a parish nurse. Some larger churches have a nurse either volunteering or on staff that would do things like check blood pressures, help people with medical issues find the resources they might need, host CPR/AED classes.

In the interest of keeping shared ministry moving, the councils should work to form a committee with all three churches. Thinking two to three members from each church to meet when they see fit to work to continue sharing activities and events flowing together. This will not be a committee to push a three-point parish together but to just encourage mutual mission and sharing ministry.

Closed with Lord's Prayer.

Meeting adjourned 7:40 pm.
