A Message From Our SAM

What would life be like without being able to read the Bible? Most homes have at least one. There are many translations with different languages that countless people in our world can have access to God's Word.

This all started many years ago.... 500 years of God's word in common language. There is an article in the September Living Lutheran by J.R. Jones that offers us information of how this came to be – The true story of Martin Luther's "September Testament". Martin Luther was known for his disagreements on the papacy. His study, translation and publication of the Bible brought God's Word to all people not just those working within the church. It opened the eyes of many to what God was teaching when Luther translated the New Testament. This started the reformation of the church – where our Lutheran roots came from.

COUNCIL MEETING October 12, 2022 Unapproved Minutes

MEMBERS PRESENT: Clara Edin, Bill Jansen, Sandra Pavelka, Carolyn Steele, Denny Birkholm, Yvette Maloney.

DEVOTION & OPENING PRAYER: Led by Clara.

ACCEPTANCE MINUTES FROM SEPTEMBER COUN-CIL MEETING: Motion by Denny, second by Carolyn, motion passed.

SEPTEMBER TREASURER'S REPORT: Discussed and reviewed. The audit report was received and is available to any member wishing to review.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Clara provided summary of her pastoral care. Clara will be doing the joint service on Thanksgiving Eve in addition to her scheduled Sundays.

• MINISTRY TEAMS:

Property—Denny spoke with Arrow Lift today. and damaged another board while they were working on it. The replacement part has been ordered and is to be repaired next week. Denny and Chuck Drilling had a walk through with MN Power to evaluate our energy use. He is awaiting MN Power's recommendations. Denny sought an estimate for a chair lift from the main floor to the sanctuary from Arrow Lift. The estimate came in at \$5,500 with the costs for the electrician.

- Family Ministry—Heidi put the youth related items in the newsletter.
 Sandra has not heard of any interest in the fall youth gathering.
- Music and Worship— Music selections for October were made and the group will be meeting to plan November.
- Circle of Faith—The November 20th church service will be led by

Circle of Faith. There's still some discussion of a Christmas bazaar.

Visioning Committee—
 The group met yesterday and some high level financials were put together. They reviewed and discussed the other multi-point parish models presented. A draft is expected by January.

New Business: Discussed the need for a chair lift to have because the elevator

sometimes breaks down. Askov fire department will help with the October community meals. Discussed the possibility of offering fire extinguisher checks if people bring theirs from home. Cookie will check to see if we can find someone to check fire extinguishers.

COF plans to have the annual bake and craft sale on December 3, 2022. Cookie mention she could do a demonstration for making krumkake.

Visioning Committee Meeting Minutes October 11, 2022

Present: Amy Frazer, Laura McCaughan, Bill Jansen, Dwain Ecklund, Greta Detzler, Minister Clara Edin, and Pastor Cindy Gray.

Opened with prayer.

Budget, income and expenses for both Grace and Emmanuel were shared.

Discussion ensued regarding the snapshot of the finances of the three churches. Things that were not discussed was the comparison of attendance, nor the Sunday offerings given. The following finances were compared.

At the end of July 2022, Bethlehem had \$49,698.15 available funds and \$154,944.35 dedicated funds. Bethlehem year-to-date (YTD) income at the end of July was \$49,065.32 and their YTD expenses were \$58,332.44. Bethlehem was behind \$9,267.12 in income versus expenses at the end of July 2022. Bethlehem currently has no monthly obligations. Bethlehem is expecting to need a new roof on the church in 5 to 10 years and is anticipating that cost to be \$25k - \$50k.

At the end of July 2022, Emmanuel had \$42,630.47 available funds and \$29,226.81 in dedicated funds. Emmanuel YTD income at the end of July was \$38,699.81 and their YTD expenses were \$38,994.94. Emmanuel was behind \$295.03 in income versus expenses at the end of July 2022. Emmanuel currently has no monthly obligations. Emmanuel is not expecting any major future capital outlay.

At the end of September 2022, Grace had \$9,603.76 available funds and \$178,885.63 dedicated funds. Grace YTD income at the end of September was \$63,471.24 and their YTD expenses were \$64,067.00. Grace was behind \$595.76 in income versus expenses at the end of September 2022. Grace currently has no monthly obligations. Grace is not expecting any major future capital outlay.

Some mutual ministry was discussed. The shared service for Thanksgiving is being hosted at Bethlehem this year. Margaret Christensen sent an email to Bill to suggest a Christmas Carol Sing at Bethlehem. Bill is to forward Margaret's email to Pastor Cindy to share with the Worship and Music Committee. Potentially Sunday December 11th at Bethlehem. More information will follow on this from the Worship and Music Committee.

Discussed the varying Parish agreement examples that were passed out last month. Discussed leading with the heart, addressing mission and service but keeping the business clear and straight-forward. Identities is a tricky subject. Are we planning on being three congregations or one parish. Eventually the Visioning Committee will need to address and identify what it would look like for Sunday bulletins, music, etc. We need to be willing to be a part of something new. Discussion was had and decided to make a mission statement in the next month or two.

Group to send ideas to Amy and Dwain for ideas for mission and purpose verbiage.

Next meeting will be November 15th at 6:30 pm at Bethlehem.

Meeting adjourned at 8:00 pm.
