A Message From Our SAM

When it is meal time I tell my grandchildren they need to fill up their tanks. We need food to nourish our bodies so we can keep healthy and have energy. The same is for our Spiritual lives. How do you fill your tank daily? I like to use the "Our Daily Bread" that is offered at our church for one of my daily devotions. They are located on the kiosk, or just ask me and I will make sure you get one.

I also fill my tank with music. The devotion this past September 16 is titled HALLELUJAH! He will reign for ever and ever. Revelation 11:15, with the reading for this day 15-18 verses.

Here is Lisa M. Samra's devotion for that day:

Astonishingly, it took Handel only twenty-four days to write the orchestral music for the Messiah oratorio – today perhaps the world's most famous musical composition, one performed thousands of times every year around the world. The magnificent work reaches its climax nearly two hours after it begins with the most famous part of the oratorio, the "Hallelujah Chorus."

As the trumpets and timpani announce the beginning of the chorus, voices layer on top of each other as the choir sings the words of Revelation 11:15: "And he shall reign for ever and ever." It's a triumphant declaration of the hope of eternity in heaven with Jesus.

Many of the words in Messiah come from the book of Revelation, the apostle John's account of a vision he had near the end of his life describing events culminating with the return of Christ. In Revelation, John returned again and again to the theme of the return of the resurrected Jesus to earth—when there would be great rejoicing with the sound of choirs (19:1-8). The world will rejoice because Jesus will have defeated the powers of darkness and death and established a kingdom of peace.

One day, all the people of heaven will sing together in a magnificent choir proclaiming the majesty of Jesus and the blessing of His forever reign (7:9). Until then, we live, work, pray, and wait in hope.

How does the return of Jesus to reign over the earth provide you with hope now? What songs encourage you with reminders of the majesty of Jesus?

Prayer: Come quickly, Jesus, to establish Your reign over the earth. Amen

- Add-ons to your initial registration are accepted as space allows.
- Standard registration applies to each registration received on or after October 18, even if the bulk of your group registered early.

REGISTRATION

Registration is a two-step process! You will register your GROUP through the NE MN Synod, and your HOUSING through Cragun's. Both will be submitted online. Registration worksheets to help you collect needed information will be posted by September 1, 2022.

HOUSING

In recent years, congregations have had an increasing number of special housing requests to accommodate a variety of special needs. We expect that to be even more true this year with COVID-19 concerns.

Congregations will now make their housing arrangements directly with Cragun's through a special form just for our group. Payment for housing will also be with Cragun's and must be made by credit card.

More Housing Updates:

- Participants are required to stay at Cragun's to participate in the All Youth Gathering. Why? Programming does not
 end until midnight and begins by 8:30am the next morning. Part of the experience is being together so we can be
 connected and build relationships.
- Book your rooms early! Rooms will be held until October 17, 2022. After this date, rates are guaranteed but room availability is not.
- Cancellations: Cragun's is very generous with our group, and will work with congregations as much as possible when there are last minute cancellations to adjust room assignments to maximize occupancy rates. Cancellations will be allowed without penalty, but please note that you will be charged based on the final actual occupancy of your room (1 person will be charged single occupancy rate, 2 people will be charged double occupancy rate, etc.). You are welcome to house participants from different congregations together! You are responsible for making those arrangements. To help congregations connect, we have set up an All Youth Gathering event in the Northeastern Minnesota Synod Facebook Group to help congregations find roommates for youth in order to get a lower rate.
- You are allowed to put 5 participants in one room! If you do, you are responsible for bringing your own mattress and bedding.
- Cabins are available! First come, first served. Cabins have 1-7 bedrooms and require walking outside the main event building.
- You are expected to follow our NE MN Synod Housing policy in making housing assignments.
- Substitutions and cancellations must be done in writing by contacting Lorie at Ibourassa@craguns.com.

Housing Cancellation Policy: Cragun's is very generous with our group, and will work with congregations as much as possible when there are last minute cancellations to adjust room assignments to maximize occupancy rates. Cancellations will be allowed without penalty, but please note that you will be charged based on the final actual occupancy of your room (1 person will be charged single occupancy rate, 2 people will be charged double occupancy rate, etc.).

PIZZA

Large pepperoni, sausage and cheese pizzas from Little Caesar's are available for purchase for \$7 each. All pizzas must be pre-ordered with your Group Registration and are non-refundable. Last day to add to your pizza order is November 7. Additional orders will not be available when you arrive at Cragun's. Pizzas can be picked up during Hotel Life, late evening on Night One. This is NOT supper, so plan a stop for supper on your way to Cragun's!

Visioning Committee Meeting Minutes September 13, 2022

Present: Minister Clara Edin, Pastor Cindy Gray, Amy Frazer, Bill Jansen, Dwain Ecklund, Marvin Rostberg, Laura McCaughan, Greta Detzler, and Deacon Colleen Bernu.

Opened with Prayer – Pastor Cindy.

Dwain passed out July YTD 2022 and 2021 finances of Bethlehem Lutheran Church.

Discussion ensued about Bethlehem's budget, will need to gather information for bank account balances, all funds, obligations, and dedicated funds (what they are for and) No mortgages on parsonage, or any of the churches. Information on Grace and Emmanuel's financials were not yet ready.

Deacon Bernu discussed the housing scenarios in the area and explained how wonderful it is that there is a parsonage available.

Deacon Bernu passed out three shared ministry agreements and discussed them. "Water from a Rock" – two churches who put God and their mission at the forefront of their agreement. The churches knew they needed to cover the "nuts and bolts" (finances, etc) but wanted to be sure their mission and vision was on the same wavelength. SALT Parish is more logistic based, and the third parish agreement is kind of in the middle. Pastors and leadership will come, eventually. All three pastors/leaders are in/near of our synod and are available to be reached out to.

Deacon Bernu recommends that we figure out what our 3-point agreement will look like first so we know what will go into our site profile when it comes time for a call. However, we need to focus on what we need to do to build our parish relationship, and the call focus will fall into place.

Bill discussed trying to plan out the timeline and goals of what we'd like to see happen and discuss when.

October 8 Walking Together—\$25/person in Cloquet sharing mission – including Good Shepard – sharing stories to get to where they are. Colleen will send story from Good Shepard. NEMN Synod site.

Deacon Bernu suggested the decision we need to make is what foot are we going to lead with? Logistics then figure out shared ministry? Or are we going to lead with shared ministry, then follow with logistics?

Discussed bringing in more SAMS in to the churches from the congregations. Training is required but could be an option. Discussions need to be discussed between the congregation and Deacon Brenda Tibbetts. Also discussed learning from each other and relying on each other and supporting and celebrate each other. BLC is encouraging members to go to Lay Leader Network (training). We (everywhere) need to have discipleship training. Keep eyes open for someone that you think might be a good SAM.

Discussed how far out calls are, could be as much as 3 years. Discussed how calls and filling candidacies go. Everything is on the table to do ministry well with ministers that are supported.

Honest conversations are needed at the congregation level to come up with creativity to make this agreement and ministry attractive for new ministers, as well as taking care of our ministers/leaders.

HOMEWORK: Prayerfully read the covenants and find the bits that speak to you, individually, and then come together, and have conversation about how to move forward, on what foot.

Finish collecting finances (and dedicated funds).
